Progressive and creative, our Business Improvement Area (BIA) has served as a commercial hub in downtown Hamilton since 1976, holding the title of Hamilton's first BIA.

Our diverse membership includes over 140+ businesses and offers a vibrant mix of businesses from cafés, restaurants, retailers, and world-class theatre productions at Theatre Aquarius.

The boundaries of the The International Village BIA are: West Avenue to Mary Street including Main Street East, King Street East, and King William Street in Downtown Hamilton.

Managed by our Executive Director Susie Braithwaite, our seven-member volunteer Board of Management as well as our Community Engagement Coordinator Brendan Wetton, the purpose of the BIA is to help create a successful community in which businesses can thrive.

We continuously advocate for our members with a focus on beautification and maintenance, safety and cleanliness, unique programming, and promotion of the area.

What is a BIA?

A Business Improvement Area (BIA) is a not-for-profit association representing a group of property and business owners within a defined geographic area who collectively develop, promote, and protect the commercial viability of the area.

A BIA is established through a municipal by-law governed under The Municipal Act, 2001.

How are BIAs Funded?

Property and business owners within the BIA's boundaries automatically become members, contributing through a levy paid with their property taxes to the municipality.

Each year, the Board of Management votes on the BIA budget to be collected through the levy.

These funds go directly back into the area through advocacy, beautification, maintenance, programming, and business support.

The Hamilton Light Rail Transit (LRT) project aims to create a 14 kilometer multi-modal corridor with an enhanced street scape from McMaster University to Eastgate Square. In the International Village BIA, the LRT line will run along King Street East between two stations at Wellington Street and Mary Street. City of Hamilton Financial Incentives

The City of Hamilton offers a range of grant programs for property and business owners. Grant programs aim to help rehabilitate properties in the core and in Business Improvement Areas (BIAs).

Commercial District Revitalization Grant (CDRG)

Provides grants to support long-lasting and predominantly exterior physical improvements to the appearance, accessibility and environmental sustainability of commercial properties. Activities supported by this program include exterior building façade improvements.

Commercial Vacancy Assistance (CVA)

Provides grants to new permanent or 'pop-up' commercial tenants of a presently vacant at or below grade commercial space.

Grants for Graffiti Removal

Provides \$200 grants (up to \$1000 annually) for removing graffiti on commercial and mixed-use commercial properties located within strategic commercial districts.

Reporting

Call 9-1-1 for crimes that are in progress (if you feel threatened, aggressive panhandling, assault, theft, and graffiti, etc.). This line directs you to police, fire or ambulance services.

Call 905-546-4925 and email our Crime Manager (cgurman@ hamiltonpolice.ca) to report incidents that are **non-urgent** (i.e. noise complaints, thefts, vehicle and property damage, counterfeit money, a suspicious person, etc.).

Report Online a non-urgent crime (value of property lost or stolen must not exceed \$5,000).

Waste Collection

Curbside Collection for recycling, compost, and garbage occurs on Tuesday. Curbside collected material must be set-out prior to 7am on the day of collection and not prior to 7pm the day before, as per the City of Hamilton waste by-law. Holidays may affect waste collection.

Alleyway Collection (North Side of King St. East between Wellington St. North and Mary St. North) for garbage only (no recycling or compost) occurs Monday, Wednesday, Friday between **10am-12pm**. Alleyway collected material must not be set out on off days (Saturday, Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday) or ourside collection time.
